EXTRA INFO for BOTH Adelphi and Hallsville:

- a). We will hold the last measure on each song, including the Star Spangled Banner.
- b). I will start the song for the second time....don't anticipate.
- c). We will play each song twice, except for "Star Spangled Banner".
- d). We will go straight through the Americana Book from the front. ..except for "SSB".

- e). This should be more than enough songs, so we will probably SKIP a few.
- f). For the musicians who were at Hallsville, in 2022, YES, we will all sit back from the monument at Hallsville in the shade this year. (Valerie..remind me).
- g). I will provide chairs, so I could use some help carrying them back over to my truck afterwards. Thanks!

However, for the newer musicians who were not with us in 2022 in Hallsville, last year the Main Speaker never showed because he overslept, and the gun squad was late, so we filled in with a lot more music than we were originally supposed to do. So I have programmed "heavy" so that we can skip songs rather than doubling back and playing them twice.

Music Trivia:

John Phillip Sousa wrote an autobiography titled, "Marching Along".' It is a good read for anyone so interested.

Story # 1:

In the book, he admits to not understanding money and his monetary value as a composer. Accordingly, he sold many of his best marches for almost no money at all.

- a). Many were sold for \$5.00
- b). "High School Cadets": \$25 dollars
- c). "Semper Fidelis", "Washington Post", and several others were sold for 35 dollars a piece

Story # 2:

Before Sousa joined the Marine Band, he was a touring musician in a band. They were playing in a city in Kansas, and they arranged with the local band that if the local band would play a concert outside the theater before Sousa's concert started, they could get into the show for free. All they had to do was come in with their instrument and that would be their 'ticket".

So the local band played, and Sousa was in the back of the theater getting ready when a messenger approached and asked how many people were in the local band. Sousa replied about 20. Sousa was told that almost 100 people with instruments had gotten in free for the show thus far.

Sousa went out to the front of the theater and found that as soon as a musician got in free, he/she would find an open window, and pass the instrument out to anyone else standing outside so that they could get in free as well.
