Kerns said that he first played the piano. While in high school he was a paritone horn player and in college he also added trombone to the list.

He received his BA from Otterbein and completed work for his master's at Boston University. During World War I, he studied composing and conducting at Biarritz American University in France.

Since his retirement Kerns says he seeps busy on his 200 acre farm where he lives with his wife Marjorie. The Circle "K" Ranch is a vacation farm on Gay Dreisbach Road which will be eatured in the May issue of "Ohio Magazine." Kerns also has four children, three daughters and one son, who all play musical instruments.

Kerns is a member of Ohio Retired eachers Association and currently lays with the Adelphi Band. He also eaches private lessons at his home. While talking about his years in the Circleville City School system he said, "The students were very well behaved...I understand that isn't so true today."

Senior band member Mike Starkey remembers Kerns as a person who "treated students like they were somebody.

"I thought a lot of him. He seemed to be well liked by most of the students," said Starkey.
