SECTION # 1: INTRODUCTION

SECTION # 1: INTRODUCTION

Let's just call this what it is.....a biography......written by an admitted amateur.

But, in this case written by an amateur fairly experienced in this subject matter since I have proudly been a part of the Adelphi Community Band for just south of 60 years.

But having said that, this is easily the most comprehensive biography written so far on what has been proven to be one of the oldest community bands in the nation, The Adelphi Community Band of Adelphi, Ohio.

This biography is basically a chronological story of the band, its musicians, the music, the events they performed for, and all its various activities through the years based on the information currently known to us from the over 3,000 documents currently found in the band's digital library.

The Adelphi Community Band has pretty much always been "kind of" based in Adelphi, a small town in northeast Ross County, Ohio with a current population of @ 330. However, the musicians participating in the band have also come from numerous surrounding small towns, from surrounding counties, and even from other states. Coming back to play in the band from considerable distances for specific events has always been kind of a "homecoming" of sorts for the musicians.

For multiple reasons, the band has also been known to hold its practices in Adelphi, Hallsville, (another small town near by), Adelphi again, and most recently even in Circleville, Ohio. Circleville is a town located @ 30 minutes away from Adelphi but much closer to the home communities of the current musicians.

The band officially claims a start date of 1880. However, some local documents written for the Centennials, Sesquicentennials, and even Bicentennials of the surrounding towns actually list substantially earlier dates.... a topic that will be discussed later.

The band has often been billed as the oldest band in Ohio and one of the oldest in the nation. That can be an honest discussion point as there are several bands in Ohio, let alone nationwide, that openly claim a specific start date that may be earlier than the one claimed by the Adelphi Community Band. Yet, when you read the details from their own web pages, many of those bands will stake a claim to a "start" date earlier than 1880, but will acknowledge that there have been several times in their histories when the bands ceased operations for a time, or two, only to come back sometimes several years later and begin operations again under the very same band names.

However, even with that as a qualifier....or even a disqualifier....we so far have only uncovered a very few community bands nationwide that try to claim any kind of start date earlier than 1880.

Regardless of the absence of any kind of official, nationwide ranking of how old the Adelphi Community Band is compared to other community bands, it has certainly been around long enough, and has been active enough, to rightfully hold a significant role in its several decade history of its particular section of Southern Ohio.

Between the stories shared by the older musicians during down time in performances, to countless newspaper and magazine articles that can now be found in the band's digital library, it seems like there haven't been many events, or even many <u>kinds</u> of events, in South Central Ohio in the last 143 years where you would <u>not</u> have found the band performing.

The band has played for a variety of functions in a variety of places, to include political rallies and politicians (regardless of what political party was being supported at the event), county fairs, bond rallies, state fairs, birthday parties, corporate picnics, dedications and rededications, centennial celebrations, sesquicentennial celebrations, bicentennial celebrations, riverboats, Presidents, Vice-Presidents, Governor Inaugurations, and for pretty much any festival that celebrated any kind of food, vegetable, event, or flower.

You would have also found the band performing in support of the military by playing for the soldiers returning home from **Porto Rico** (1898), to a day-long picnic for 170 Glider Pilots training close to Circleville (1942), to playing for one of the last two Civil War Veterans from Ross County (1941), to selling war bonds, and for numerous other related events.

NOTE:

This paragraph references "Porto Rico" and not "Puerto Rico".

Here is an explanation for the apparently current change in spelling:

On December 7, 1931, Congress passed S.J. Res. 36, which changed the spelling of "Porto Rico" to "Puerto Rico" in official U.S. records, documents, and communications.

The music the band continues to play, and for which it is well known by their enthusiastic audiences, remains fairly unique among area community bands. Anyone attending a performance by The Adelphi Community Band would have the opportunity to hear almost exclusively the classic marches, serenades, and novelty numbers written from the late 1800's to the early 1900's. This was the time when many music scholars acknowledge that some of the best music of this type was being written and played around the world, thanks to the compositions of Sousa, Jewell, Alford, Chillicothe's own Will Huff, King, Fillmore, and many others.

Several years ago, an unofficial web site for the band was started by one of its musicians in order to help preserve this invaluable history of the band, and to let any prospective audience member or musician know of the band's upcoming performance schedule. Over these intervening years, several thousands of hours have been spent digitally scanning any pictures, Internet articles, and literally any scrap of paper that could be found related to the band or any of its musicians, in order to make that

information available through the band's web site. This has included personal notes, band newsletters, concert programs, correspondence, practice lists, and both magazine and newspaper articles.

And, we even have both the audio recording, as well as the written transcript, of a local radio interview three of the most senior musicians did in 1980 after returning in from performing at the band's 100th anniversary concert on the steps of the Capitol Building in Washington DC.

But even with all of that accomplished thus far, general Internet searches are still routinely being done in order to find unexpected sources of documentation about the band, to include trade and specialty publications, and the vast networks of various social media platforms. One of the most fascinating, and unexpected, discoveries that came from this research was found in a blog from apparently a Pickaway County (*Ohio*) resident who compared the beauty of a boat "parade" in Venice, Italy to the Adelphi Community Band playing in the Circleville Pumpkin Show!

We will let the author's words from that particular discovery speak for itself:

"We do a lot of parades in Ohio. After 18 years here I know a parade when I see one. This was a Parade. On boats. I'm thinking this is where the tradition of Parades got started, as it makes sense why they are called "floats" now. This float combined the musicianship of the Adelphi Band with the royal personages of the Pumpkin Show Queen and court. Yes, I am comparing Venice to Circleville, Ohio's Pumpkin Show Parade". (1-15-2018)

Amazing!

The result of all this work has simultaneously been immensely rewarding to read, staggering in its volume, and somewhat intimidating for all the stories and raw information about the band that all of these items have held that has never been found in one place before....until now.

As of this writing, this unofficial band web site has grown from a vague draft of a concept to a fairly extensive history of the band, which can be expected for a community band that claims a start date of 1880....or perhaps 1873....but we'll cover that later in this biography.

The band's web site also currently includes well over @ 3,000 pictures dating back to @ 1890, ten years after the band's declared start date. Plus, there are links to many YouTube videos and audio recordings of band concerts that have been captured since 1969!

It is both amusing, and intimidating, to just sit and ponder about how much more complete this history of the band could be, and how many more thousands of documents, pictures, and videos of the band we would have available to enjoy, if everyone would have had smart phones and Facebook pages as far back as the 1880's!

While I personally use the band's web site on an almost daily basis in order to remind myself of past events in which I personally participated, to enjoy the music, and to reflect on lost friends and musicians, I have also enjoyed finding out more about those places and events discussed by the other musicians about which I heard many stories through the years.

As a result of all this time spent researching the band, it certainly became apparent that the amount of information already found about it can be overwhelming. It also quickly became apparent that anyone really wanting to do some personal research on the band on any particular topic could benefit from some central source that would show a little more information on what each document on the band website is about than can be gleaned by just visually scanning the names of the computer files on the band's website. A cryptic file name limited by computer software constraints sadly often leaves very little clue as to the total treasure trove of information that can be found in any particular document.

So, those thoughts gave birth to this biography.

This biography will take documents from the band web site and list:

- The source
- Date of the item
- The event the band was playing for and any interesting facts about it,
- The name(s) used in that document to reference the band
- The names of any musicians listed as being with the band
- The names of the songs being played
- A hyperlink from each document summary back to the original Internet document so that anyone with sufficient interest can go back and read the entire document for further information. I actually highly recommend the Reader do this. It is one thing to find that the band played at an event at 7:30 PM on a specific date and time. But it is another pleasant discovery to also see what else was happening around the band on that date, at that location, and at that time.

There are several potential benefits to this entire process:

- Since the intent is to present this document electronically, creating the hyperlink from each document summary back to its complete original gives this project a "full circle" approach.
- Over the considerable history of the band, and often for unknown reasons, various publications have listed the band with different names. Sometimes even the musicians apparently weren't specific in relating in any specific document what the "official" name of the band was.

Sadly, questions probably still unsolved by even this considerable amount of research include:

- Was there ever only ONE band between Hallsville and Adelphi?
- or ONE band from each city that combined at some point?

While the majority of the information researched would lead to one conclusion, there are some documents containing several confirmed inaccuracies that would support a an entirely different one.

Through all of that informality, it has been difficult to separate any official band name from nicknames given by friends and family, or just outright mistakes that maybe can be attributed to lazy journalism.

Sometimes the names found in these articles that have been given to the band have been outright amusing. Some have just been crazy. And some have had at least a grain of truth in them. It was thought that adding this research component about all the band name variations into this project might possibly answer questions that some of us *(now)* more senior musicians have always wondered about in filling in gaps in the band's history.

But one constant is this entire debate is that if we have a picture of the band with a band name on the Bass Drum, then that apparently WAS an official name of the band at that specific point in time. In all of our years of musical experience, we have pretty much found that Bass Drums don't lie!

• The musicians in the band are often approached by enthusiastic audience members with the questions of, "Do any of you remember (insert person's name here)? He/she played in the band at some point!"

The truth is that, not surprisingly, there have been very few efforts found to date to comprehensively list the musicians who have ever played in the band over its current 143 year history.

One fairly thorough attempt, however, tried to document the musicians, Majorettes, Directors, and Drum Majors who participated in the band from 1923 to 1975, a span of almost 52 years. That list came up with @ 170 names, but those years currently only comprise about a third of of the length of the band's current existence. The research for this biography has now helped to document over 340 musicians total to date who have been found to have played in the band, which is certainly the most comprehensive effort on this topic to date.

Sadly, however, even the hours spent creating this new list of musicians will still leave it grossly incomplete. There are likely documents in existence, somewhere, that would help to answer more of these questions and better flesh out this specific component of the band's history. But they have not yet been made available yet for review.

Each document summary provided in this biography will have enough info to give you a
better idea as to what is included in each article.

Since this biography is searchable by text, the reader can easily jump from specific event to specific event, track a specific musician's activities from year to year, look up the names of

the songs played during both performances and practices, and even just focus on specific time periods.

• Not unexpectedly, there is a lot of duplication of information in the documents found in the band library that I have tried to <u>not</u> replicate here.

For example, to the credit of many of the event organizers, the same event information would be in multiple articles over multiple days in the same newspaper. Then, this same information, and even the very same article, would also be posted in multiple newspapers from other sources across the state.

For at least some sense of brevity, this project will not attempt to summarize <u>each</u> document in the library if all it does is repeat the same information found in other documents from either the same, or different, sources.

You are now ready to start reading this biography.

I have to confess that it has been fun for me to get to this point in the process of preparing this biography. To personalize this, this band has been a big part of almost 60 years to date in the lives of my brother and I, and a good many years in the lives of our parents, my wife, and our son.

And after all, this band has some amazing stories to tell!

And Lastly, Why is This Labeled Volume 1?:

Well, that decision was the result of a slow-walking realization that, no matter the level of thoroughness reached in researching the information presented in this document, there is considerably more information out there that access to might be granted at some future date.

In fact, I have just recently obtained several more documents on the band that will provide a good start to a Volume 2!

When this type of situation happens, then there are really only two choices to consider:

Try to incorporate all the new information into the information already included here.

Not a very convenient option.

This process results in trying to repeatedly slide through a computer document now @ 1,600 pages long in order to insert the newly found article into the correct chronological and alphabetical slot, pulling out the names of musicians, events, and Directors to add to the separate lists compiled from all this research, and so on.

Or, just go ahead and write an additional volume, or additional volumes, with any additional

volumes capturing the new information discovered since the release of Volume 1.

Without question the first option is extremely tedious.

I have already done that to some extent with this document, and that experience has firmly convinced me that the second option of multiple volumes will satisfy even my level of curiosity about the band's history in a much quicker, but equally efficient, manner.

Decision made.

SECTION # 2: WAIT...THE BAND IS HOW OLD?

One of the first topics that needs to be addressed is trying to identify exactly how old the band is.

As confirmed in numerous documents produced over many decades, the band has consistently claimed a start date of 1880. In fact, that is the date that served as the foundation on which the band traveled to Washington DC to perform on the steps of the Capitol Building in 1980 in recognition and celebration of its 100th anniversary. And for the band to have been recognized in the Ohio Statehood Day Activities in 1980. And both for and during countless other official documents and presentations.

However, for pretty much every document found that specifically lists a start date of "1880", there can probably be found at least one more document that just gives a generalized range of when the band started:

- The band has been going almost 90 years,
- The band started almost 60 years ago.

And so on.

As can be expected for any organization this old, however, the selection and recognition of 1880 as the official start date for the band comes with multiple mathematical and mechanical difficulties.

- Who would have thought in 1880 that the band would have lasted THIS long, or even anticipate that any accurate and readily available record that could be found of anything involving the band, or anyone involved with the band, might prove to be of considerable interest in the many decades since?
- In the absence of an abundance of either convincing and detailed paperwork, or even corroborating pictures conclusively proving one start date over another, much of the band's history is now solely dependent on available newspaper articles and memory. Not surprisingly in the researching of this biography, **neither** of these sources have proven to be incredibly reliable.
- Sadly, and maybe as anecdotal evidence of of the perils of relying on anyone's personal memories for this research, with my own advancing seniority in the band I have sometimes surprised myself to find how easy it is to quit worrying about the detailed accuracy of any of the stories I share about the band. At this point in my life, I have so far outlived all but a couple of the other musicians who were there at the time of practically any event being discussed, and who could still convincingly contradict me.
- The band's history is complicated due to the fact that the "official" band name apparently changed with some frequency throughout it's history. Or, in some cases, did it? Sadly,

journalists of any level can often be either notoriously unreliable, lazy, or dependent upon the information given to them, which may not have been accurate in the first place.

- And sometimes you just have to wonder if the journalist was being pranked by whichever musician was being interviewed at the time based on the extremely odd name of the band subsequently used in that article.
- There is some confusion from all the stories referencing the history of the band, especially when multiple articles talk about some of the musicians starting in 1924 because that's when it was "reorganized"......the exact word used in many of the articles. There has been very little information found that reliably offers any explanation for the word "reorganized" in this sense. But finding this information and that specific term in only a few articles out of over 3,000? Are any of these few articles true, false, or just imperfect memories? The Reader can review the specific contents of any related articles later in this biography and make his/her own decision.
- The bottom line is that, if you don't even know the names the band used to identify itself through all these centuries and decades, than how can you even begin too tell how old it is?

This is discussed in some detail in Section 19, "What's in a Name?" where an examination of the documents in the band's digital library have revealed almost 30 different names used to reference the band. Some of these names used to identify the band are certainly true. Some are possible. Some are clearly incorrect. And some are just crazy, for lack of a better word.

Often, as many as 2 or three totally different names for the band were used even in the same article. But, more often than that, the same newspaper would use 2 or more different names for the band in the sequence of articles that were written to follow any specific event from planning, to the day of the actual event, and through to the usual post event after-glow discussion by the event organizers.

However, someone arbitrarily selecting the band start date as 1880 has admittedly had at least some level of consistency in the articles written about the band over many decades. But still not without exceptions, as noted below

Here are **some** of the examples found from the band documents on any discussion about the age of the band.

7-31-1962, Chillicothe Gazette:

According to **Arthur Hinton**, Superintendent of the Centralia Schools, the **Adelphi Band** was organized more than 75 years ago, by the **Bowsher Brothers**. It was then known as **Bowsher's Bunch**.

NOTE:

1962 minus 75 would indicate an approximate band start date of 1887.

8-2-1963, Chillicothe Gazette:

On 8-2-1963, the Chillicothe Gazette published an article about the Clarksburg Field Day that stated, "Entertaining crowds at the 48th annual Clarksburg Field Day was the Adelphi Community Band. According to Pryor Timmons, the band which is composed almost entirely of farmers, is the oldest community band in Ohio, having been organized some 80 years ago."

NOTE:

1963 minus 80 equals an approximate start date for the band of 1883.

8-25-1969, Chillicothe Gazette:

"Since 1920, a group of musicians have been performing as the Adelphi Community Band"

NOTE:

It is difficult to know where the journalist got this information, or why he/she chose to write this article in this vague manner.

And even for many decades after that, many other names for the band were used and often the terms "Adelphi Band" and "Adelphi Community Band" were used interchangeably, and often both in the same article.

The term "Adelphi Band" has been seen in articles as early as 1898.

6-28-1975, Lancaster Eagle Gazette:

There is a picture in this article. The caption below the picture states:

"A row of Trumpeters of the Adelphi Band fill the air with old time rhythm at the Tarlton Fish Fry Thursday evening. The band of men range in age from 16 to 85 and have homes across Fairfield, Pickaway, and Ross Counties. Members claim that the Adelphi Band is the oldest of its type in the state. The original band of 1884 was a mixture of Hallsville and Adelphi residents. Ninety years later, the band still plays at over a dozen festivals in mid-Ohio through the summer season.

Later in the same article, it states:

"The village of Adelphi, nestled in the northeast nook of Ross County, has quietly enjoyed the melodic machinations of their community band since about 1884."

Later in the same article, it states:

According to David Pontious, the band was functioning in 1884 when his father, Chauncey, was playing at the age of 14.

NOTE:

The focus of this article was on Raymond Connett, Director.

But leading a band is nothing new to Connett-the founder of the Ohio University Band in 1923.

The Adelphi Men's Band is the oldest such unit in Ohio, going back to the 1860's.

2-28-1980, Chillicothe Gazette:

Chauncey (*Pontious*), born in 1870, started with the band when he was 14, and played cornet and baritone through the years.

NOTE:

This statement came from Dave Pontious, one of the members who started with the "reorganization" of the band in 1924. Dave is the son of Chauncey. By this accounting, then, the band would have started at least by 1884. Chauncey was supposed to be one of the original band members from 1880.

6-10-1980, Lancaster Eagle-Gazette:

The band was started in Hallsville and the Adelphi Community in Ross County in 1880. The group disbanded for a couple years and reorganized in 1924.

6-29-1980, Transcript of a Radio Interview with Dave Pontious, Herman Hinton, and Dave Hinton:

In June 1980, **Dave Pontious, Herman Hinton, and Dave Hinton** were interviewed by Circleville Radio station WNRE. That station was physically located in a building right next to Rt 23, on the west side of the road, and just north of Circleville. The radio station has been off the air for decades, although the building is still there. It has been repurposed in the decades since the 1980 radio interview.

That radio interview was recorded by one of the musicians onto a cassette, and later made into a YouTube video, and a typed transcript prepared for convenience. The link below is to the typed transcript.

In this radio interview, Dave Pontious is clearly heard stating the following:

"Seems like at thatuh...at .one time they had the Hallsville and Adelphi Bands. Each. There was 2 bands. But they was...there were all together. They were the same people, you might say "

NOTE:

Of all the thousands of documents searched for this project, David Pontious stated that there was a band in Hallsville and a band in Adelphi at the same time.

However, if this were true, you would think that, since the both bands were is such close proximity to each other, about 3 miles apart, that they would both be invited to perform at the same events. Yet, no such article has been found to show that this happened.

And in contrast, Laurelville had a Community Band, and several articles **can** be found where both the Laurelville Band and the Adelphi Band performed at the same event.

With all respect to David, the weight of the evidence we have on hand at this moment does **not** support his assertion that both Hallsville and Adelphi had bands at the same time.

Informality marked the event, all local residents being just plain folk in helping make

the soldiers feel at home. Most of the boys participating were from the East, the Atlantic seaboard being heavily represented.

The day's festivities started at 9 AM when more than 50 vehicles and one school bus lined up in front of the courthouse to start the trip to the airbase.

The group was delayed for almost an hour at Lockbourne while some of the soldiers who had signed for the outing completed various duties. A few minutes after 11 the cars drove into Circleville with a state highway patrolman leading the procession. Several army cars and two jeeps were in the parade to Gold Cliff.

The soldiers spent most of the time prior to the dinner hour just touring the park. But about 1 PM with tables filled to capacity with fried chicken, salads of all kinds, huge cakes, and just about every kind of food imaginable were uncovered. A dinner call was sounded from an Army Bugler, and the fun began.

The Lockbourne boys came to Circleville to eat, and that they did with a vengeance. Fried chicken was piled so high that even after 170 boys had filled their plates, it was almost impossible to tell where the chicken had been removed.

Time after time the boys renewed their attacks on the fried chicken and all the other food taken to the park prepared by housewives from Circleville, from practically all the county villages, and from the countryside at large.

After the soldiers were given first chance at the food, the hundreds other people filled their plates. All the Pickaway County folks ate their fill, but many got more kick out of watching the Lockbourne boys enjoy their food.

The appeal for homemade cake resulted in at least 100 of the biggest, tastiest, and finest cakes ever placed on one table being assembled. Much of the leftover food, including a score of cakes, were stored in the jeeps and hauled back to the air base.

55 hostesses played important roles in entertaining the guests, dancing, skating, and swimming with the soldiers, and strolling with them through the parks.

ceremonies honoring his 22 years of service to the Show.

First of all, two 5 ton elephants from the Mills Brothers Circus were in the huge parade that preceded the presentation activities. To everyone's recollection, this was the first elephants had even been in a Pumpkin Show parade.

Secondly, Colville was commissioned as an honorary Navy Recruiter.

Third, Dick Martin, a local painter, painted Colville's portrait. The artwork, done with a standard automobile spray gun, proved to be a splendid likeness and was left on display at Court and Main. After outlining Colville's features with white cloth, Martin proceeded to use the spray gun filling in the sketching. Martin thinks that he is the only person who utilizes this method.

The elephants were a last minute but welcome addition to the parade. Jack Mills, owner of the circus, was passing through and called the Herald to say that he was on his way to Chillicothe. Arrangements to include the animals were quickly made.

Columbus May Jack Sensenbrenner was on hand for the event, and efforts to get him to ride the elephant ended suddenly when someone pointed out that a Democratic Mayor would be riding the symbol of the Republican party.

One elephant is 101 and believed to be the oldest elephant in captivity. The other is 43. Many local people here remember that the Mills Brothers Circus used to have its winter quarters here on the Fairgrounds.

Others will remember the fire there, set by Robert Dale Segree, who later admitted setting the catastrophic circus fire in Hartford, Connecticut. As the barns were burning in the Circleville Fire, the elephants were released in order to prevent a stampede. Several farmers in the area will recall that the animals made a vivid impression while wandering the vicinity.

The Hallsville-Adelphi Community Band is scheduled for concerts on Saturday at 1:00 and 6:00.

NOTE:

Here is a link to a fascinating but tragic story about Robert Dale Segree where he apparently confessed to setting fire to the 1944 Ringling Circus Brothers Circus in Hartford, Connecticut where 168 people died and 142 were injured. That fire happened during a performance where 7,500 to 8,700 people were present. Segree apparently confessed to this fire but later recanted. The article states that Segree was from Circleville.

He also admitted to setting 25-30 other major fires in Maine, New Hampshire, and Ohio.

Archie said that the balloon rises about 800 feet per minute, and that he was a veteran of 1,800 jumps since he was 14 years old.

Adelphi lays claim to having the second oldest band in the state. Only one other, Johnstown, has existed longer.

According to **Arthur Hinton**, Superintendent of the Centralia Schools, the Adelphi Band was organized more than 75 years ago, by the Bowsher Brothers. It was then known as Bowsher's Bunch.

Later, it became the Adelphi Band, then the Adelphi-Hallsville Band, but reverted to the Adelphi Band name which it has today.

Love of band music has kept the band active over the years, Mr. Hinton said, and the band membership has varied from a small number in the beginning to a high of 40. Personnel now number 25. With a small community, recruitment has been a problem, as the younger people have diversified interests.

Practices in the early days were held in the Red Man's Hall, and the Knights of Pythias Hall in Adelphi, while a Hallsville store was the gathering place for musicians at other times. Now the practices are at Adelphi School from March to its customary last appearance of the band at Halloween.

Mr. Hinton recalled that **Frank Hickman** of Lancaster was a former Director of the band and he was followed by **Charlie Proxmire.** The present Director is **Roderick Shaw**, once a member of the University of Michigan's Marching Band and now a

music teacher in Pickaway schools.

The band has made frequent appearances at most civic events over the years. An old photograph shows the band ready to leave for Chillicothe to help celebrate the visit of Governor Campbell in 1890. The band will make its appearance at Clarksburg Field Day on Thursday.
